Update letter on the 'Nautilus' Initial Project Assessment Re-Consultation

Dear stakeholders,

Thank you for your responses to our July-August 2024 consultation on the updates to the Initial Project Assessment (IPA) for the Nautilus Offshore Hybrid Asset. As a reminder, our IPA is used to assess the consumer benefit of projects applying for our cap and floor regime for interconnectors, and is used to grant projects a regulatory regime in principle.

The IPA is conducted at an early stage in an interconnector's development, after a grid connection agreement has been obtained but before a project goes through the planning and consenting process. On average a project starts construction 3-5 years after a cap and floor regime is granted, and becomes operational 6-10 years after a cap and floor regime is granted. Ofgem is not involved in planning and consenting procedures. Ofgem also does not participate in the decision-making process over a project's connection location.

The developer of the Nautilus project notified Ofgem of three key changes to the project:

1) a proposal to change the connection location of Nautilus from Grain to Leiston, as a measure to reduce the project's estimated high constraint costs associated with the location in Grain, 2) confirmation that Nautilus' Line 2 will be 1.4GW, and 3) confirmation of the cost and revenue sharing arrangement between GB and Belgium. These changes to the key characteristics of the Nautilus project merited a re-consultation on the assessment of its benefit to GB consumers.

Since publishing this re-consultation, and following new analysis to address stakeholder feedback on the OHA IPA consultation, it was found that connection at the originally assessed location, Grain, was acceptable. Therefore, Ofgem has issued a decision on the IPA for Nautilus under the assumption that the project connects to Grain. However, we have accounted for the updates on the Line 2 capacity and cost and revenue sharing. This decision paper also includes Ofgem's responses to relevant responses from this re-consultation which affect our decision-making on Nautilus.
