

### Annex 1. End of the transition period – Notice of proposed licence modifications to the licence conditions of the Electricity Distribution Licence

To: All holders of an Electricity Distribution Licence

#### **Electricity Act 1989**

#### Section 11A(2)

## Notice of statutory consultation on a proposal to modify the standard conditions of the Electricity Distribution Licence.

- 1. The Gas and Electricity Markets Authority (the Authority) proposes to modify the standard conditions of the Electricity Distribution licence granted or treated as granted under section 6(1)(c) of the Electricity Act 1989 by amending Standard Licence Conditions under section 11A(1)(b):
  - SLC1 (Definitions for the standard conditions)

set out in Annex 1.1.a, and 1.1.b to this notice.

- 2. The modifications we propose to make are to reflect the changes in the legislative framework that will be implemented after the transition period ends at 11pm on 31 December 2020.
- 3. The effect of these proposed modifications is to ensure that the references in the licence to EU law (e.g. Directives, Regulations and Commission decisions) shall be read as references to such EU law as it had effect immediately before IP completion day subject to any further amendments as may be contained in statutory instruments made under the European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018. The proposed modifications do not seek to change the current obligations and duties of licensees, nor do they seek to change the current policy position as reflected in the licence conditions.
- 4. The proposed modifications and the reasons why they are proposed are stated in Annex 1.1.a to this notice. The effect of the proposed changes is set out in paragraph 3 in this notice. Further information concerning the proposed modifications is contained in the letter entitled 'Statutory consultation on consequential licence modifications due to the end of the transition period' which can be found at <a href="https://www.ofgem.gov.uk">www.ofgem.gov.uk</a>.
- 5. Any representations with respect to the proposed licence modification/modifications must be made on or before 24 December 2020 to <a href="EUExit@ofgem.gov.uk">EUExit@ofgem.gov.uk</a>.

- 7. If we decide to make the proposed modifications, they will take effect not less than 56 days after the decision is published.

# 1. Condition 1. Definitions for the standard conditions Introduction

- 1.1 This condition sets out most of the defined words and expressions (all of which begin with capital letters) that are used in the standard conditions of both Section A and Section B of this licence, and gives their definitions next to them.
- 1.2 But where defined words and expressions are used only in a particular standard condition, their definitions are included in that condition.

### **Definitions in alphabetical order**

1.3 In the standard conditions of this licence, unless the context otherwise requires:

"Agency for the Cooperation of Energy Regulators" means the European Union Agency for the Cooperation of Energy Regulators established established by Regulation(EU) 2019/942 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 5 June 2019 establishing a European Union Agency for the Cooperation of Energy Regulators (recast); (EC) No 713/2009 as construed as reference to and read in accordance with the correlation table in Annex II of Regulation (EU) 2019/942 establishing a European Union Agency for the Cooperation of Energy Regulators (recast) and as it had effect immediately before IP completion day.

"Directive"

means Directive 2009/72/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of 13 July 2009 concerning common rules for the internal market in electricity and repealing Directive 2003/54/EC as it has effect immediately before IP completion day as read with the modifications set out in the Act.

"IP completion day"

has the same meaning as that given in section 39(1) of the European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Act 2020.

"Regulation"

means Regulation (EU) 2019/943 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 5 June 2019 on the internal market for electricity (recast) <u>as it has effect immediately before IP completion day as read with the modifications set out in the SI 2020/1006.</u>
